#### Attendance 2024-2025

We cannot stress enough the importance of regular school attendance. We love to award children on good attendance and improvements in attendance patterns too.

#### **Roadworks on Friars Walk**

Works on a new school zone along Friar's Walk will begin in early September. This will result in some disruption along Friar's Walk while works are in progress,

therefore we appeal to you to adhere to the exit and entrance points per class group on the next page.

The School Zone is designed to:

- Improve front of school access and
- Reduce traffic at school gates which increases safety

The School Zone also aims to address safety concerns raised by parents in the Safe Routes to School survey conducted in 2021.

90.7% of respondents to the survey said they would support works at the front of school that improve student safety, putting pedestrians and cyclists first.

The School Zone will include colourful signage, pencil bollards, planters, and road markings to clearly mark the front of school area. Foot-



paths will be widened and a formal crossing will be introduced at the school gate. More details will follow.

Where children have brothers and sisters in school the family enter and exit through the entrance of the eldest sibling.

We also encourage Park and Stride from Glór carpark. Parking at Glór is available free of charge at school start and finish times and Glór is only a 7 minute walk from the school.

#### **School Meals**

We are committed to healthy eating in HFSS. Please ensure you edit your child's order weekly on the Carambola App. (by Friday midnight).

There are so many delicious, healthy options to choose from. The App is simple and easy to use.

When the children return to school, only hot lunches will be served. This is in keeping with the Government initiative to provide hot healthy lunches to all school children.

Please ensure you edit your App regularly otherwise the same lunch will be delivered each day.

All children will be given a new reusable bottle on the first week back to school. Please ensure all water bottles are filled daily at home as water is not provided at school.



# Here's what should go in a healthy lunchbox



Below options if NOT getting a school-provided lunch:

# Wholemeal cereals and breads, potatoes, pasta and rice

One portion from the bread and cereals



- 2 thin slices of wholemeal bread
- 1 small bread roll
- 1 tortilla wrap
- 1 pitta bread
- 4 to 6 crackers or breadsticks
- 1 cup of cooked rice or pasta or couscous
- 1 small bagel

#### Meat, poultry, fish, eggs, beans and nuts

One portion from the meat and meat alternatives food group...



- 2 slices of cooked meat
- 1 to 2 hardboiled eggs
- Small can of tuna, salmon, sardines or mackerel
- 4 tablespoons of hummus

# Vegetables, salad and fruit

At least one portion from the fruit and vegetables food group...



- 1 medium apple, orange,
   banana, pear or similar size
  fruit
- 2 small fruits plums, kiwis or similar size fruit.
- Half a tin of fruit in its own juice
- Handful of dried fruit
- 1 small bunch of grapes
- Chopped vegetables, e.g. cucumber, carrot, celery

# Milk, yoghurt and cheese

One portion from the dairy products food group...



- 1 pot of yogurt or custard
- 2 cheese triangles
- 2 thumbs of cheese
